On behalf of the Board of Trustees, our Founders, and everyone at Foundation 92, I'm pleased to share our 2025 Annual Impact Report.

I am incredibly proud of our team, whose energy and commitment have enabled us to engage more than seventeen thousand people through programmes that support education and employability, improve health and wellbeing, and strengthen community connections. More importantly, behind every number is a story, of confidence rebuilt, opportunities created, and individuals achieving things they once thought were out of reach.

In a challenging economic climate, the strength of our partnerships has never been more important. We are grateful to the organisations across the public, private, and voluntary sectors who have stood alongside us, enabling us to extend our reach and deepen our impact.

Our work continues to be rooted in the power of football to connect, inspire, and create change. We couldn't do this without the ongoing support of Salford City Football Club. Together, we are making a tangible difference in the lives of people across our city.

In 2025, we proudly supported 17,452 individuals across Salford and beyond through 25,345 hours of delivery, reaching 229,511 attendances. This impact was made possible by the dedication, compassion and skill of our staff team and volunteers, who work tirelessly to support communities facing inequality, poor health and limited opportunities.

Our Community Engagement programmes reached 10,263 individuals, creating safe spaces for young people to belong, build confidence and make positive choices. Through our partnership with Transport for Greater Manchester, 3,844 young people were engaged in behaviour change work that contributed to safer communities. We are especially proud to have increased female participation in Premier League Kicks by 150% since 2023, reflecting our commitment to inclusion.

Through Education and personal development programmes, we supported 4,704 young people, with 89% reporting greater understanding of anti discrimination and 94% feeling more confident reporting it. Our Health and Wellbeing work reached 389 individuals, helping improve physical health, mental wellbeing and social connection through programmes such as Fit 92 and Dementia Walking Sports.

Fundraising activity throughout 2025 ensured our work could continue and grow, with highlights including the Champions for Children Gala Dinner delivered in partnership with Royal Manchester Children's Hospital, raising £267,412, supported by our Founders, Hospital ambassadors and an extraordinary network of partners who believe in our charities vision. Seasonal initiatives such as December to Remember, which again delivered, for the 5th year in a row, thousands of presents to families facing hardship, showcased the generosity and kindness that exist across our city when organisations come together.

Our heartfelt thanks and gratitude go specifically to Salford City FC, who have amplified our reach through player appearances, matchday access and inspirational experiences.

Crucially, all the work throughout 2025 was made possible by the generosity of our funding partners, founders and supporters, who share our belief in the power of community. Together, we are not just delivering programmes, we are changing lives and strengthening Salford for the future.

In the past year they have supported a wide range of Foundation 92's projects & events, continuously striving to support the health and wellbeing of communities. Alongside driving the vision of Foundation 92, our founders have directly been involved in the charity's fundraising events of 2025, including Football, Padel & Golf Day's which in turn raised over £45,000 to continue improving lives in Salford.

The Foundation 92 founders played a pivotal role in our 2025 December to Remember campaign, which saw the charity deliver over 2,000 presents across Salford and Greater Manchester aimed at families and individuals who may have been facing hardship and disadvantage during the festive period.

# SALFORD CITY MATCHDAYS

At every home Salford City match day, Foundation 92 runs the pre-match Match Day Hub for supporters. The Match Day hub includes:

- Xbox Gaming
- Arts & Crafts
- Football Tables
- A visit from Billy the Lion
- A visit from Salford City FC players

For every Salford City home league fixture, Foundation 92 invites guests to experience The Peninsula Stadium through the following initiatives.



## Team of the Week

We invite local grassroots teams to each home game, who receive 18 free matchday tickets. Each team gets the opportunity to be flag wavers when players walk out, and take half-time penalties on the pitch against George the Lion!

## My Special Day

Delivered in partnership with the FreeKicks Foundation, to support deserving young people who may have gone through difficult times. Each home game, one young person gets the opportunity to be a Mascot for the day, and receives their own, free Salford City FC t-shirt.

## Premier League Fans Fund

This aims to strengthen connections between the football club, their fans and local communities, through initiatives such as fan-focused and fan-led projects, including schemes for under-represented groups to further enhance inclusivity.

During 2025, Foundation 92 has continued to strengthen the connection between Salford City FC and our community through a wide range of engagements.

These extend beyond the pitch, enabling the community to interact directly with men's first-team players, women's first team players and academy scholars.

## EDUCATION & PERSONAL DEVELOPMENT

In July and October, Foundation 92 delivered two financial literacy workshops, engaging 37 scholars. This focused on budgeting, saving and financial responsibility. In addition, scholars also visited Premier League Kicks sessions at Albert Park, supporting delivery and mentoring younger participants, as well as reinforcing positive role modelling and peer leadership.

## SCHOOLS & COMMUNITY OUTREACH

Player appearances extended into local schools and educational settings, including December to Remember present drops at two local primary schools.

These engagements focused on aspiration, attendance, positive behaviour and healthy lifestyles.

## PREMIER LEAGUE KICKS & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

Albert Park remained a central hub for player engagement throughout the year. First team and women's team players regularly attended Premier League Kicks, Emerging Talent Centre sessions and Dementia Walking Sports, interacting with participants and completing Q&A sessions.

## MATCHDAY FAN ENGAGEMENT

Players consistently supported match-day engagement through pre-match appearances at the Peninsula Stadium. These appearances enhanced the match-day experience, providing accessible touchpoints between players and fans, strengthening the connection between the Salford City FC and its supporter base.



# COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

We have supported over 10,000 individuals across our community, through sport, youth work, holiday provision and community outreach.

The behaviour change programme, in partnership with Transport for Greater Manchester, engaged with 3844 young people alone across the transport network, contributing to a safer community.

Premier League Kicks, which is delivered across four locations in Salford, saw an increase of 150% of female participants since 2023, which demonstrates strong progression within female-only provision.

## KIARON'S STORY

Kiaron first engaged with Premier League Kicks during its initial year of delivery at Albert Park.

At that time, he was identified as lacking self-esteem and confidence, and was often bullied which resulted in poor mental health. Kiaron was often involved in aggressive behaviour, such as fighting, and local partners highlighted that Kiaron would benefit from structured and positive provision, outside of school.

Kicks provided Kiaron with free, safe and regular football sessions. The familiar setting, combined with consistent and supportive coaches, gave him a positive space and overtime, he became a consistent participant.



“He’s come out of his shell massively, and now he’s the one encouraging others.”

Beyond football, Kiaron engaged with targeted workshops focused on respect, positive choices and managing emotions. Kiaron began taking on leadership roles within sessions, building his sense of responsibility and ownership.

Kiaron’s involvement in Kicks has had a significant impact across multiple areas of his life:

- Developed new friendships, moving away from peers who had been encouraging him towards risky behaviour.
- Grown self-belief and confidence, often supporting younger participants and expressed interest in gaining his coaching badges.
- A noted reduction in any ASB and/or verbal/physical aggression and violence since regularly attending Kicks.
- Connection to Salford City FC: Kiaron built a strong sense of pride in his local club, now owning a season ticket and meeting players through appearances.

Kiaron’s journey illustrates the core impact of Premier League Kicks by providing safe spaces, positive role models, and opportunities to grow. The project has helped transform his outlook and behaviours.

His story highlights how sustained engagement through Kicks can change individual trajectories and contribute to safer, stronger communities.



# EDUCATION

Foundation 92 have supported over 4700 individuals across Education in 2025 across various programmes including Premier League Primary Stars, JD Achieve, financial literacy and small group-based interventions.

In 2025, 89% of young people reported an increase in understanding anti-discrimination whilst 94% of young people felt increased confidence in reporting discrimination.

A teacher from Butterstile Primary School said: “The PE lessons have been fantastic - the students really look forward to them and Foundation 92 staff are able to adapt their lessons to suit the needs of the young people. The support that has been given to our teaching staff has been fantastic and has really changed the way we look at PE as a school”.

A sports coach from Lewis Street Primary School commented: “She now believes in herself, and it’s all thanks to the support she received from the project”.

## RIZWAN'S STORY

**At Foundation 92, we believe every young person deserves the chance to feel confident, included and celebrated. This season, one very special participant from Lewis Street Primary School reminded us exactly why this mission matters.**

Rizwan was born with Fibular Hemimelia, a rare condition affecting the lower leg. After undergoing an amputation at a young age, he recently spent several months in a wheelchair while awaiting his prosthetic leg.

During this time, Lewis Street Primary School contacted Foundation 92 as Rizwan's confidence in PE had significantly declined. We delivered a 12-week programme for 1-1 support, using fun and engaging activities to help him rebuild his confidence in a safe environment.

Shortly after this intervention began, Rizwan was fitted with his prosthetic leg and began walking again, a huge milestone.

Seeing his determination and progress, sessions increased to twice weekly and week by week, his confidence grew. The smile on his face each time he conquered a new challenge spoke volumes about the impact of consistent belief.

To celebrate his resilience and hard work, Rizwan was selected for “My Special Day” mascot experience with Salford City FC. On the day, he received a Salford City FC t-shirt, met and walked out with the players, and took part in a half-time penalty shoot out.

For Rizwan, who had only recently started walking again, leading the team onto the pitch was an unforgettable moment for him and his family.

Lewis Street Primary School Teaching Assistant, Rachael Hall, said: “He has been in a wheelchair for around eight months, which has held him back from so many opportunities. He has lacked confidence during that time, but has recently had a prosthetic leg which he has started to use. He is so excited that he can walk again. For him to walk out with the Salford City team was amazing. He has had everyone crying this last week”.

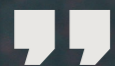

# HEALTH & WELLBEING

Throughout 2025, Foundation 92's Health and Wellbeing team has supported over **350 individuals** through a variety of health and wellbeing programmes aimed at reducing health inequalities.

These have included Dementia Walking Sports, Fit 92, and corporate fitness sessions alongside many more opportunities to build resilience and manage coping mechanisms for mental illnesses.

In particular, Fit 92 has been a great success throughout the year, with **100%** of participants improving their diet and physical activity level, and **90%** reporting improved mental health.

Foundation 92's **Fit 92** sessions have been making a huge impact, helping people improve their physical and mental wellbeing through structured, supportive, and community-driven programmes.

The sessions provided a welcoming environment for all participants, focusing not only on fitness but also on confidence, resilience and healthier lifestyles.

With guidance from coaches, participants are encouraged to set personal goals and are supported to achieve them.

Fit 92 goes beyond the gym. It's all about creating a network of people who motivate, celebrate achievements and share their journey towards improved health.

Many participants reported improved fitness, weight management and mental wellbeing but more importantly, they gain friendships and the confidence to sustain long-term changes.



## ANDREA'S STORY

**My name is Andrea Scott and I wanted to share with you what Foundation 92 has done for me.**

I have struggled with my weight for most of my life. Traditional diets worked but unfortunately temporarily, and the weight came back with a vengeance. I then allowed life and work to get in the way of my health and wellbeing. I am now at the stage in my life where I want to concentrate on myself, both body and mind.

With the help and guidance received via Foundation 92, I have managed to drop over a stone in weight. My high blood pressure is now at a normal level for the first time in four years. I sleep better and have lots more energy. I have met a fantastic bunch of people who have the same goals. With the help and support I have received from Foundation 92, I am continuing to progress towards my five stone weight loss goal.

## STROLL FOR SALFORD

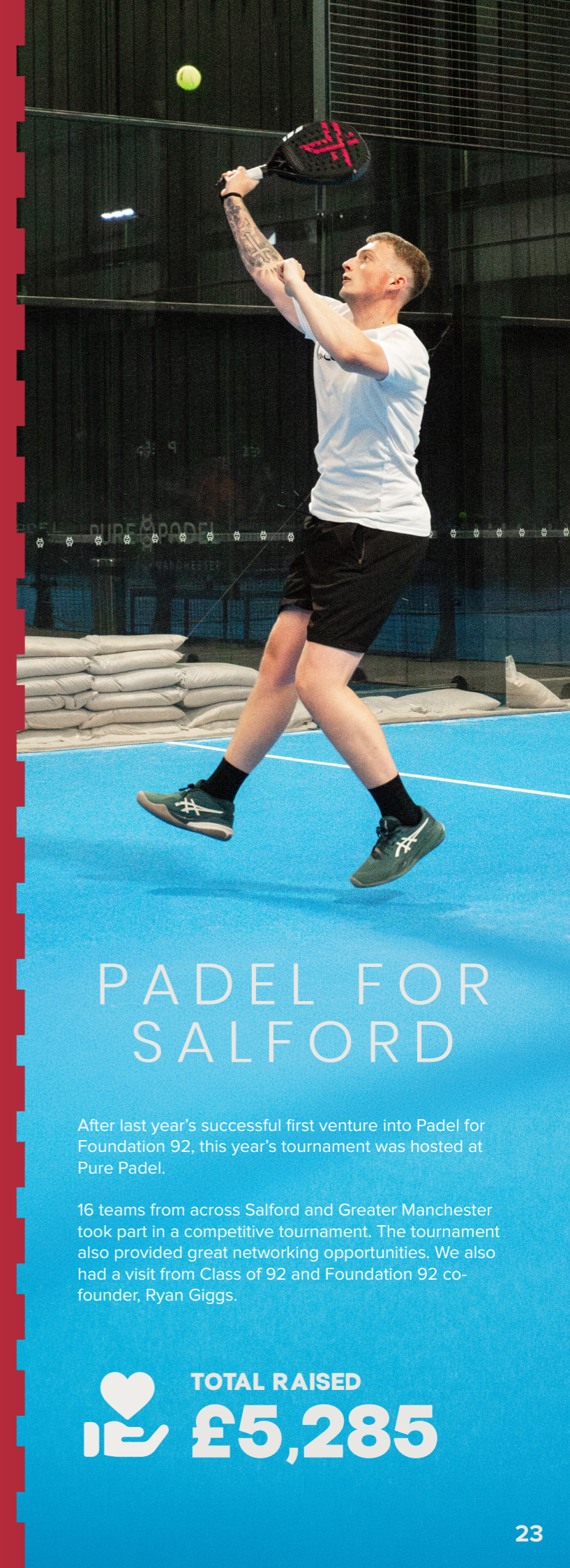
